## Yearly Professional Development Sessions started for Fellows



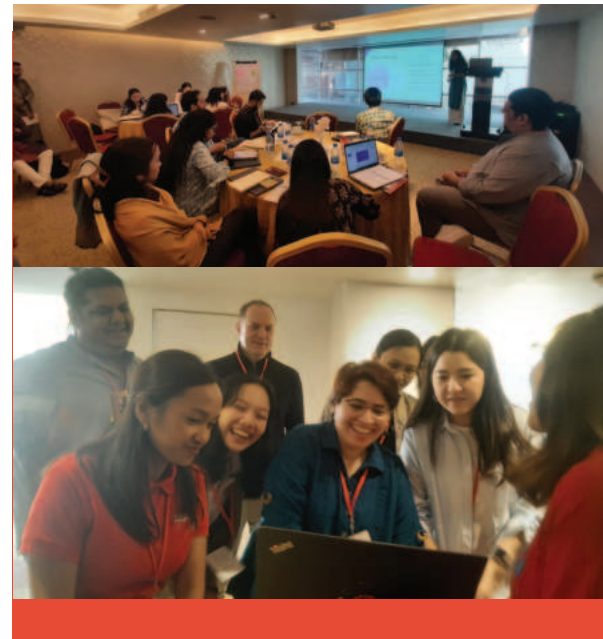
